Look what we have achieved with your support as another incredibly productive Digging Deep for Myanmar trip comes to a close. A huge thank you for everyone's generous donations and support.

This year we completed six toilets, built a house for a disabled homeless lady and her son and carried out major repairs to another house for a family in desperate need of help.

We employed local tradespeople to do the bulk of the work thereby providing valuable income for the local community. Our volunteers assisted and supervised the work with the help of our man on the ground Htein Lin. People benefiting from the projects also assisted where it was feasible.

Digging Deep is in it's fifth year and we are delighted and proud to announce we have now built 22 toilets since inception, which provide clean and hygienic facilities for over 500 people in Lintha. We have also built three houses and repaired and improved many others.

We continue to provide health & hygiene and dental care training at the English language school. The value of these programs to the community is substantial.
